## **Our Executive Director**

We launched our 'Help a Life Take Flight' campaign in 2019 to help us help more children and it has achieved just that! This campaign has transformed our message about what we do and as more people know about us and the difference we can make with their help, we have seen an increase of over 40% in our charitable income.

As a direct result, we have been able to help 39 more children and families in 2019. We have also seen a significant growth in the number of volunteers becoming involved with us and ultimately their community.


In 2019, our volunteer network doubled from the previous year. With our growth, comes more change and this year we gave our notice to leave the Bridge Centre which has been our base since it opened in February 2006.

With the offer of rent-free premises in town, generously donated by the Philip Gower Charitable Foundation, we will be able to channel even more of our income directly to our services for children and families going forward.

Finally, our application to become a Registered Jersey Charity is in its final stages and we continue to operate as a charity with integrity.

We are really looking forward to the opportunities that these changes bring for us in 2020.

## **Our Services**

- 1. Accredited Nannies
- 2. Inclusion Support Service
- 3. Early Childhood Development Programme



We accredit qualified nannies to our scheme with annual renewals to ensure we are 'Putting Children First', in line with the Government of Jersey's top priority. Anyone can call themselves a nanny, suitable or unsuitable and there is no legislation surrounding them. We ensure Accredited Nannies have the vital checks necessary to safeguard children.


## **Our Expenditure**
