Our Executive Director



2024 has been another year of growth for us. At a time where locally and nationally there continues to be a shortage of skilled, qualified practitioners working in the early vears sector, we have enabled workforce growth and development. As our charity has grown and helped more children and families, we have continued to create new and much needed opportunities to expand and enhance Jersey's early years workforce.

This was well evidenced when we opened our new nursery called Play & Learn at d'Auvergne and discovered an untapped. workforce. We received expressions of interest for our four new. part time, term time positions and 80% of them were not working in the early years sector at that time. They were all looking for a role that made a real difference for children and their families and our new team. are certainly doing just that.

They often tell me how much they love what they do, and this is something that is true and distinct across our entire workforce.

Whilst we celebrate the impact we have on the children and families we support, our day-to-day focus is also on our investment. care, development and support of our team. In essence, creating amazing outstanding, transformative opportunities for children and families starts with happy. healthy, thriving people who are always learning. But we want to help more children: we want to be certain that no one misses out on our support.

To this end, we have created a bold new vision to transform more lives. Our Partners

Our extensive and collaborative professional partnerships across Health, Education, Early Years and beyond, ensure that together we have our greatest impact on children and families.











In July 2024 10 children missed out on our support because there were no places available in local nurseries. That same month, the Minister for Education approached us and others to find solutions to ensure no more 2-3 year olds with additional needs missed out.

Play & Learn at d'Auvergne opened in October and is registered for 16 children, part time, term time. Our team of five provide a first class nurture, care and learning environment for the children and on a Friday, their parents too at our Play and Stay sessions.





Inclusion Support Service

In partnership with others, as the Island's approved provider, we enable access to children's chosen activities and clubs in the community.

Childcare Information Service

We give families and professionals the childcare information they need when they need it, tailoring this with support to help families experiencing more challenging circumstances.

Nanny Accreditation Service

We accredit nannies who meet our set of criteria creating a more consistent, professional approach and better safeguarding for children who are cared for in their own homes.

Growing and Developing the Workforce



Training and developing our workforce is at the heart of our success as an employer of choice. However, our impact extends far beyond our charity, positively influencing thousands. This year, we delivered training, provided work experience opportunities, judged and presented awards, and sponsored professional qualifications. Internally, alongside a wide range of learning and development opportunities for our team, two of our Assistant Support Workers achieved their Level 3 qualifications and have now embarked on a degree in Early Childhood Studies.

Beyond our organisation, we have played a key role in supporting the local children's workforce. Our extensive training offer included SEND Level 3, MAYBO, Makaton, and Poverty Aware Practice, as well as a Knowledge Makes Change Seminar. These sessions were delivered by our licensed and qualified trainers, organised by us, and often run in collaboration with key partners.

We have also invested in the future workforce by providing work experience placements, Highlands degree student Consultancy Project opportunities, and IoD shadowing experiences. Additionally, we joined the judging panel for the IoD Director of the Year Awards, where we helped recognise outstanding leadership.

Finally, we celebrated the exceptional practice that benefits children and families by presenting our awards at the University College Jersey Graduation Ceremony and the Wilma Allan Award Presentation evening at Government House.



2023 Income £1,097,695




Finances


